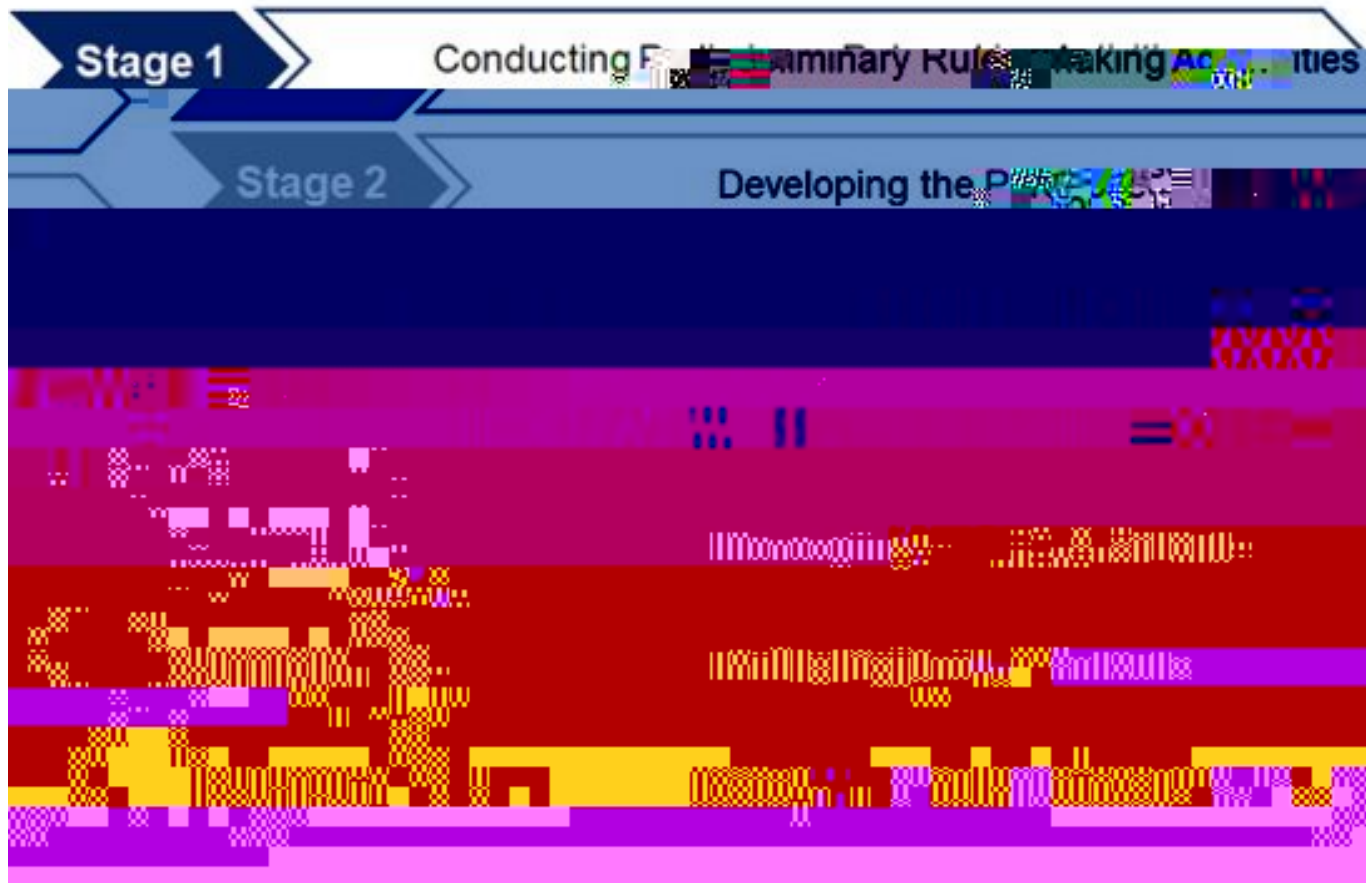

OSHA must meet certain legal and evidentiary requirements to promulgate health and safety standards.

f ANPRM:

- Announces that OSHA is initiating rulemaking
- Outlines key issues and challenges in occupational heat injury and illness prevention
- Aims to collect evidence, data, and information that will be critical to informing how OSHA proceeds in the rulemaking process



Determinants of occupational heat exposure

- Heat Exposure (e.g. thresholds and measurements)
- Contributions to Heat Stress in the Workplace

f Strategies to reduce heat injury and illness

- Programs
- Controls (work - rest cycles)
- Acclimatization
- Monitoring
- Planning and responding to emergencies
- Worker training and engagement
