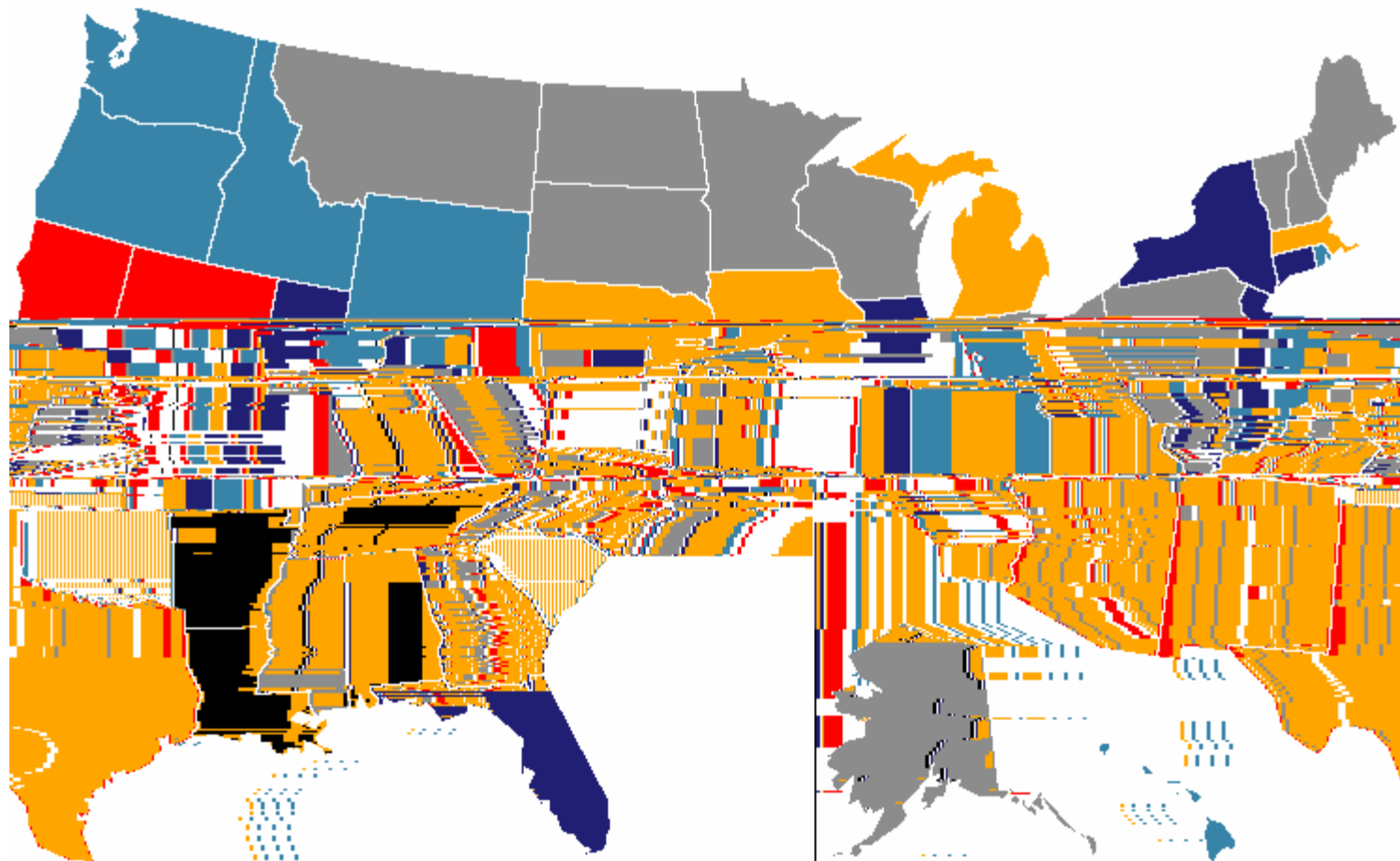

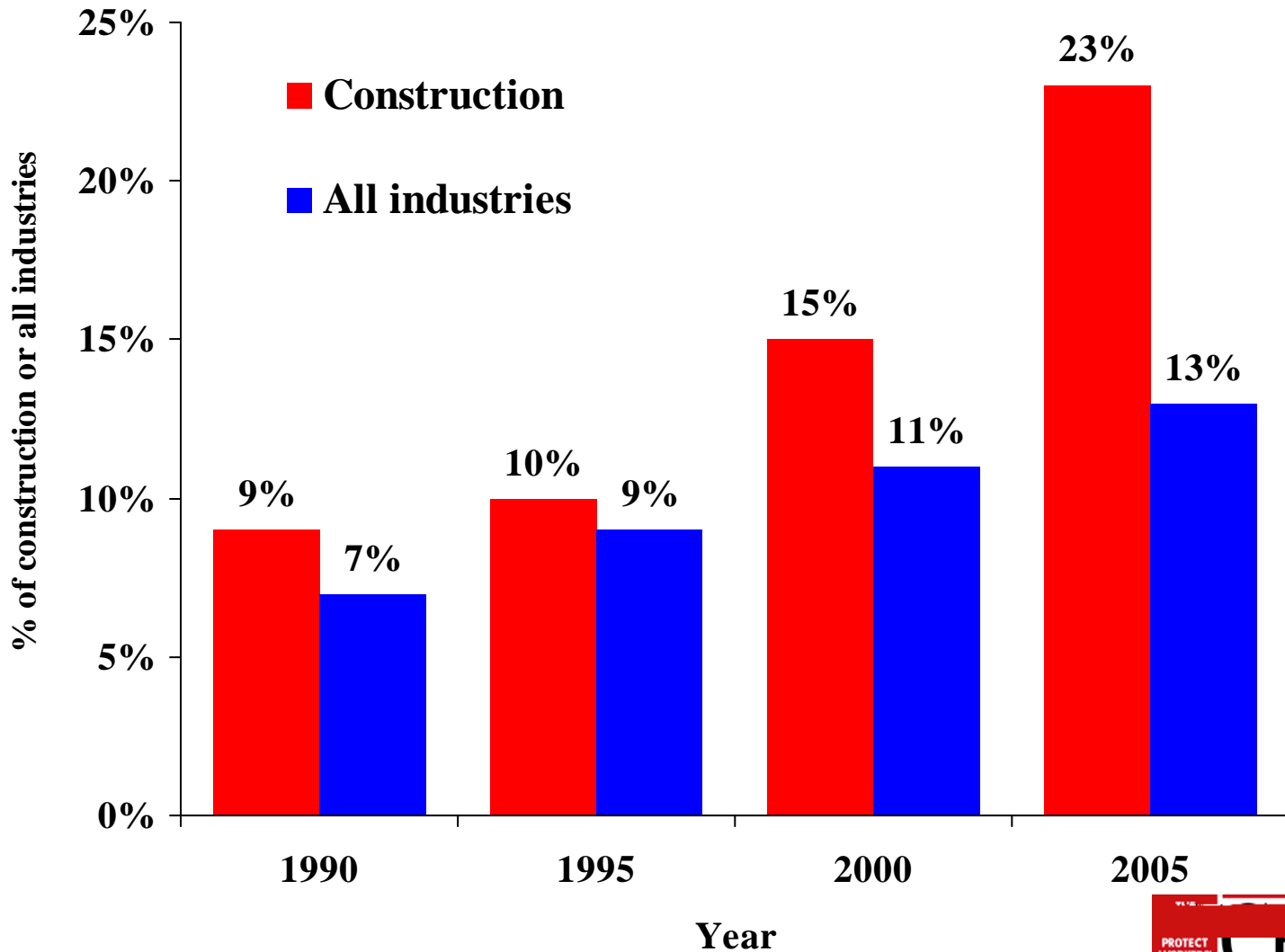

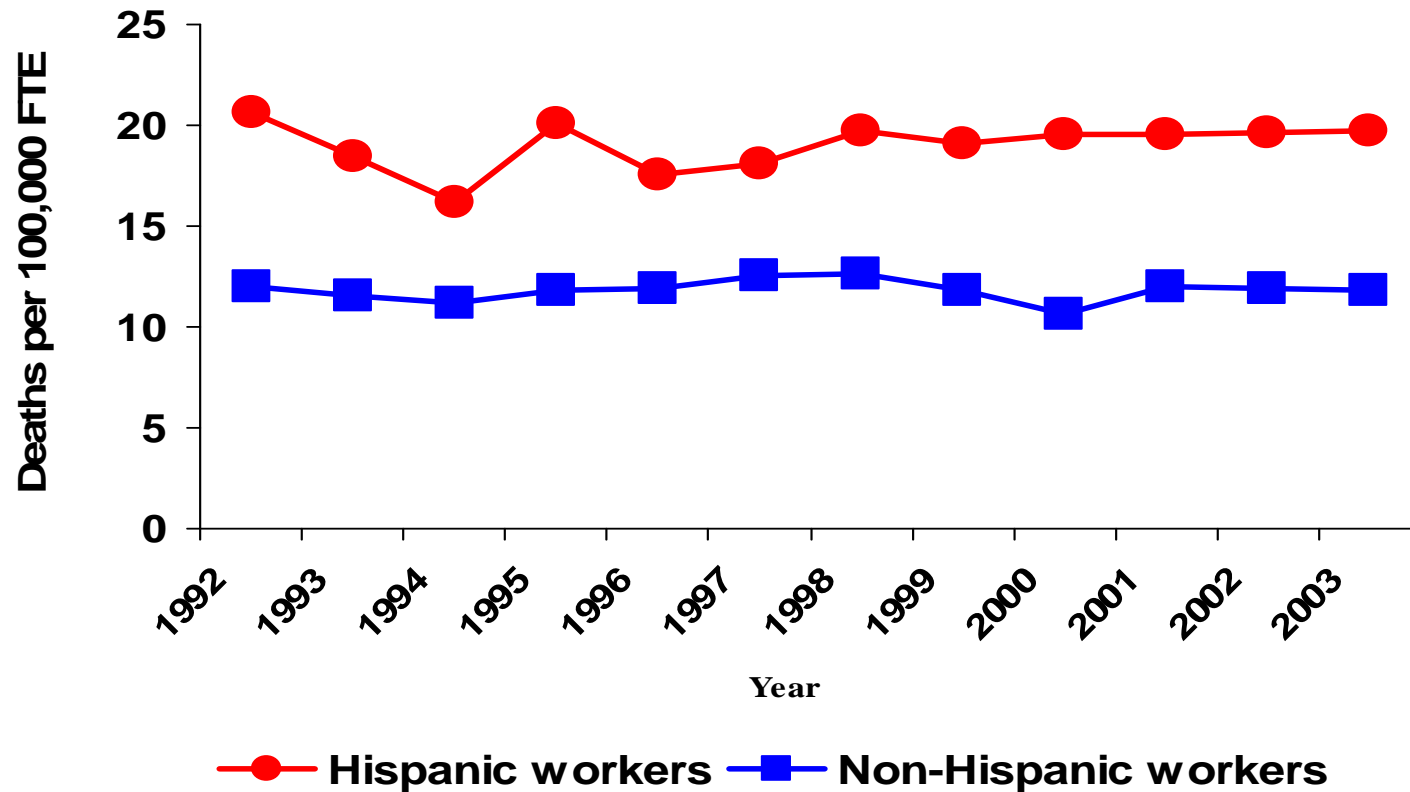

Construction fatal injury rates, 1992-2003

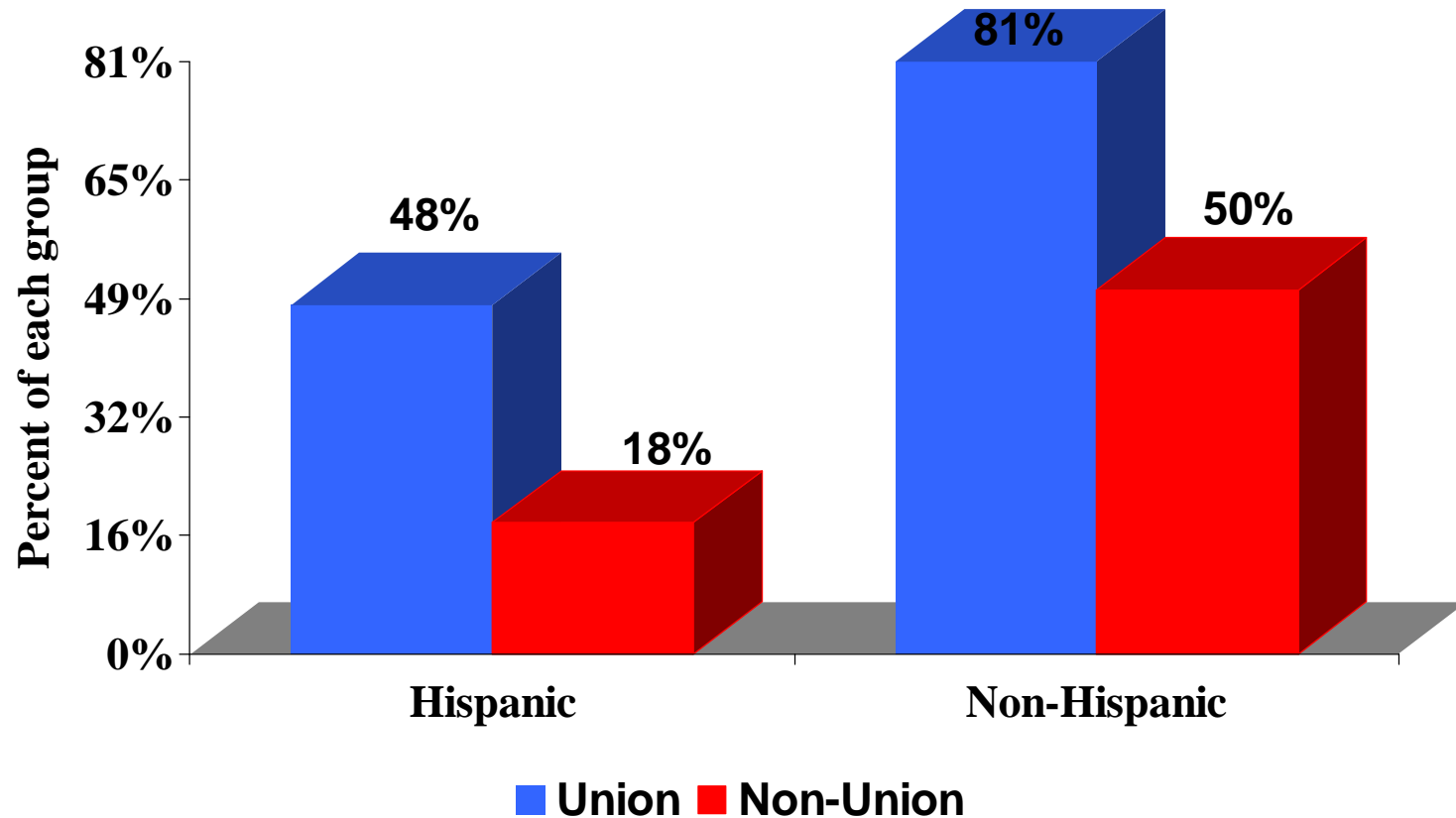

Foreign Born Hispanic Construction Workers, 2003

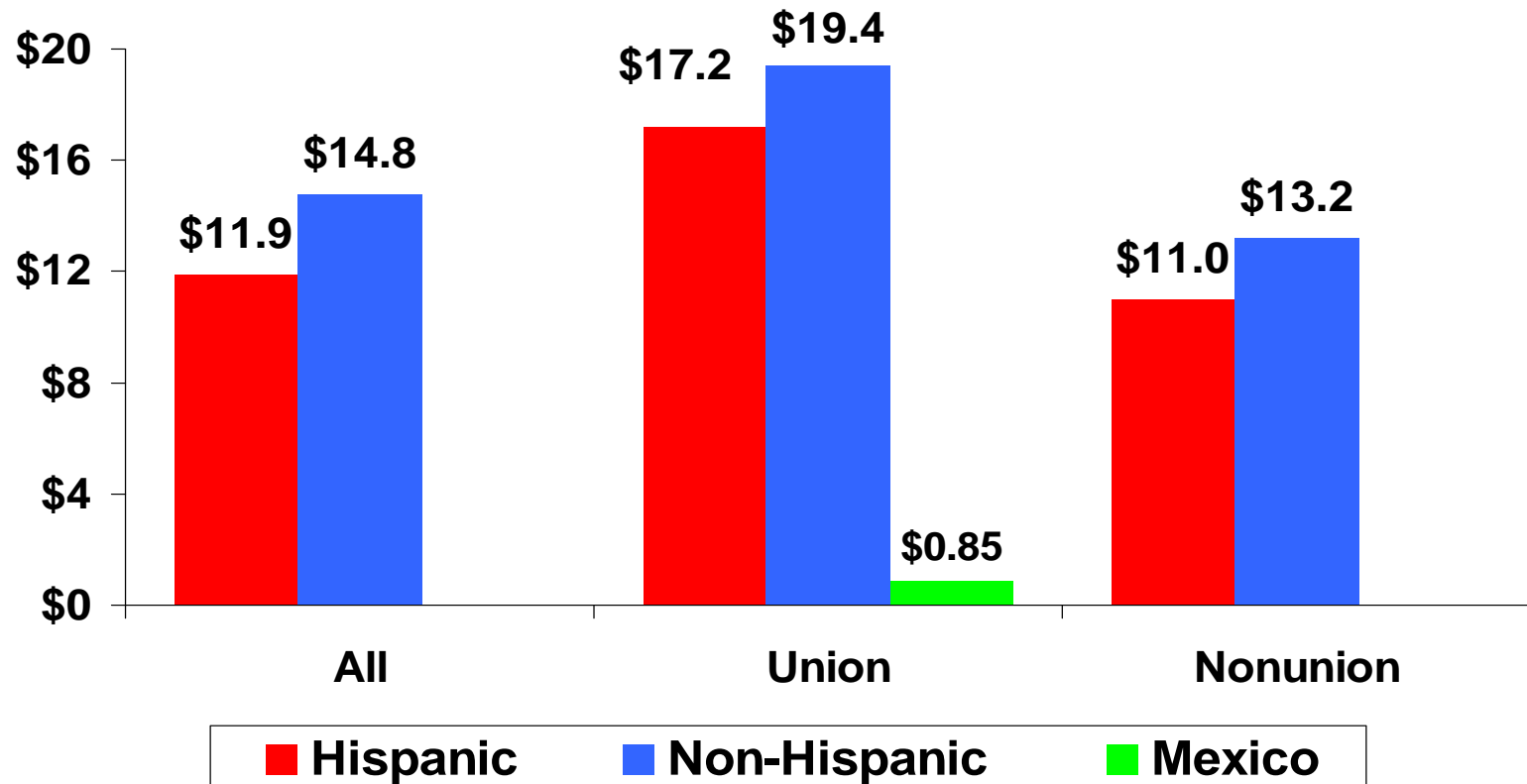


Construction workers with health insurance provided by employer/union, 2003

Summary

- Hispanic construction workers are almost twice as likely to get killed on the job
- Hispanic construction workers have half the union density of non-Hispanic whites
- Less than half of Hispanic construction workers have health insurance (18% of Nonunion Hispanic)
- Most new construction workers are foreign born Hispanics
